



Blessing Our Sacred Places

Tewa Women United, Honor Our Pueblo Existence and Partnership for Earth Spirituality cordially invite you to come and join us in a morning of blessings asking for healing of our sacred places.

The Jemez Mountains, Pajarito Plateau, is a sacred mountain for Native Peoples of the Southwest. It is the ancestral homelands for Pueblo Peoples and reflects the sacredness of mountains in many spiritual traditions, embodying stories and wisdom teachings passed on over countless generations. This is where the Los Alamos National Laboratory (LANL) is now located.

Place: Tsankawi Site

(Head north out of Santa Fe on U.S. 84/285 to the Los Alamos turnoff at Pojoaque. Follow N.M. 502 to the White Rock turnoff. Follow N.M. 4 and look for a pull-off on your left with an entrance to the park just before the intersection with East Jemez Road. Parking is on the left side of the road before the stop light that goes to LANL Truck Route.) (Approximately 2 hour drive from Albuquerque)

Date: September 12th, 2010

Time: Blessings will begin promptly at 9 am

(You will need to walk a short distance and climb a short ladder to the chosen site)
Various groups throughout the planet will also be offering prayers for blessings and healing.

Please bring water to drink, something to sit on and umbrella or hat to avoid the heat.
